Room 17 Update

This week the students have travelled each day to the Marion Outdoor Pool for Year 3-5 Water Safety. This is an important part of any child's

development and education, particularly living in Australia, with so many backyard swimming pools and fabulous beaches. The students have really enjoyed their experience and have gained invaluable life skills.

In our daily literacy block, the students are now exposed to elements of Orton-Gillingham (OG) every day, a new and exciting approach to reading and spelling at our site. We have just completed our genre writing for the term, which was persuasive writing. As an assessment, the students have written a letter to Mr. Taylor trying to persuade him to upgrade or improve various parts of the school. The wish list included; a new hall/gym, a swimming pool and an upgraded Performing Arts Centre. The students in the class are looking forward to 'posting' their letters to Mr. Taylor and getting a response early next term!

In Maths, we are looking at Number and Place

Value. We have been using one of the Department's new units of work. The units of work provide

evidence informed teaching, learning, and assessment advice and guidance for all 3 dimensions

of the Australian Curriculum. In this unit, students will develop and use their understanding of place value and the base-ten system to recognise, represent,

partition, arrange, regroup and order numbers (ascending and descendina) to at least 10s of thousands.


