Dear Families,

Congratulations to Claire Bosworth, Lesia Phillips, Katherine Pooley and Robyn Overduin for their individual nominations in the 2018 Public Education Awards - Recognising Excellence. They all have the opportunity to submit an application for their nominated awards for consideration amongst their peers across the state.

Our school has won a grant for \$10,000 from Way2Go Wheels Hub to build a covered Bike Shed. The current shed is under the gum trees and too small for the number of bikes and scooters coming to school. This project will be welcomed by our students who ride and scoot to school and provide much needed shelter in the winter months.

Congratulations to all our sporting teams for your efforts in carnivals in the last few weeks. We have been proudly represented in girls Football, Cross Country running, Rugby, Soccer and the Pedal Prix. The weekend results for Pedal Prix have been the best to date so well done to all teams, we are very proud of you all.

Staff are currently meeting with the leadership team for Data Conversations focussing on the data collected on learner achievement. They work together as year level teams to analyse the data collected and discuss the growth of students who are at standard, below and above. This provides an opportunity to discuss in depth the learning of students and the practice of our teachers to increase opportunities for students to achieve in the higher bands.



Round 3 is to be held on the 22nd June against Nativity. The game is at 1:30 at Nativity


BOYS SAPSASA FOOTBALL:
