

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Dear Families,

Many thanks to the families that visited our school on Thursday for the School In Action Open afternoon. It was a fabulous opportunity to receive a guided tour from our year 7 students and observe learning in classrooms. The students thoroughly enjoyed having visitors in their rooms to show their achievements in class.

In the lead up to book week, we have celebrated with a visit from Mark McBride the illustrator of the Deltora Quest books. He ran three sessions with students talking to them about his work, demonstrating his techniques and sharing tips for students to try. Our students enjoyed the time spent with him and were motivated to create some amazing drawings of dragons and other creatures. Look out for the activities planned with classes in week 5 especially the Book Week parade on Thursday morning at 9:10 am. The theme this year is your favourite book character. All classes have created a Treasure Chest to collect much loved books to pass on to children less fortunate than our own students. Please support this initiative and help to share the precious gift of reading.

We are calling out for volunteer helpers in the Canteen, if you can spare 2 hours on any Wednesday, Thursday or Friday please contact the school and we will arrange a time for you to come in to help. Unfortunately we have come to a situation that compromises the ongoing capacity of the canteen to provide lunches as well as recess and lunch trade. For this to continue we need the support of our community to volunteer their time and help. The canteen is very important to our students and offers families an opportunity to access healthy food for students.

Our school offers a range of opportunities for students after school including OSHC and a variety of sports that have priority use of our grounds. Students are expected to leave the school grounds by 3.30pm each day, beyond this time we do not provide duty of care. After school hours is a time where teachers are working in classrooms preparing for the days ahead, attending meetings and planning programmes with colleagues. It has come to our attention that students are riding their bikes on school grounds while the programs are operating and teachers are working. This has caused interference with the programs and work of others. Students are aware that riding and scooting on school grounds is not allowed and we ask families to understand that this extends to after school hours during week days. In the event that students are on the school grounds during this time they will be asked to leave and the expectation will be that this is respected and students will move on to other spaces in the community.

We are working with students to understand and achieve our school values of Respect, Responsibility and Integrity and hope the community will both model and support us in this quest. We look forward to the future successes of our sports teams and the activities of Book Week and hope to see many families during this time.
