Dear Families,

As the Chief Public Health Officer has advised in response to **Covid-19**, until further directions are received, we will continue to:

- minimise the number of people coming and going from our site. Wherever possible, please drop and collect your child at the gate and maintain the appropriate physical distance from other adults
- postpone all school events, excursions and camps for the next week
- require all staff and students in years 8 and above to wear masks when indoors, on public transport or on school buses. Please note that staff will not have to wear masks while teaching or working directly with students.

HVPS is accepting **new Reception enrolments**. As part of the round one enrolment process we invite our new Receptions and their families to attend an interview in Term 3 with a member of Leadership. This half hour interview is intended to offer an opportunity for the school to find out specific information about your child and how we can best support their transition and learning in their first year of school. Letters will be sent out in the coming days to arrange interview times.

The **Parent Engagement Survey** is an annual, voluntary survey for parents and caregivers. It aims to gauge the level of parent engagement with your school. The 2021 parent survey is now open. Parents and caregivers of school-aged children and young people are invited to complete the survey,

which takes less than 10 minutes. This survey gathers information from parents and schools across South Australia. It gives a broad picture of how parents engage with schools. The department coordinates the survey centrally and you might have already received a link. This avoids adding administrative workload on your child's school. The survey closes Sunday 29 August.

This term we welcome our **Pastoral Care Worker**, Caragh Larsen, to our school three days a week. In addition to her PCW support role, Caragh has attended *What's the Buzz?* training and will be conducting small group's focusing on social and emotional wellbeing. We are lucky to have Caragh at school supporting students in a proactive way.

Thank you to those students who submitted entries for our NAIDOC Week Competition, Heal Country! Today we were able to award prizes to the winners of the art competition. First prize was awarded to Benjamin R in Room 2, second to Ava K in Room 4. Winners of the colouring in competition, included, Chloe C, Mao J and Liana T. We continue to prepare for the installation of our new **boundary fence**. Further removal of the old wooden fence will carry on this weekend. Tree removal is currently scheduled for our Pupil Free and School Closure days (3-6th September). Len has removed the old scraggly diosmas that ran along the front path that meets with the upper primary unit. Several of the sections of the hedge were dead. This area will be replanted as part of the ongoing revegetation project.


