#### Kaurna Elder Visit

Tuesday and Wednesday saw the beginning of our visits from Uncle Tamaru, a Kaurna elder. Uncle's visit was the first half of a Green Adelaide Grant. The grant details are 'Collaborative exploration of Kaurna culture across our school community through art and gardens.' We aim to strengthen our relationship with the Kaurna community working with our local elder Tamaru. This will involve building on our existing awareness programs, Uncle Tamaru spent nearly an hour with each class Tuesday and Wednesday and OSHC. This week Tamaru used songs and games to help our students remember language as well as sharing many stories. Over the next two weeks we will learn more about



Bush Tucker plants and how the First nation People used them. We will also incorporate art in the Kaurna culture.

Lulu is an orphan Dorper. She is two weeks old and has been visiting our school for the last few days. Being so young Lulu needs milk feeds regularly. Lulu was wary of the students on the first day and made sure Wendy was in sight.
