# Below is some information about our school canteen service.

- We now have a Gluten Free tab on the QKR! App to make finding Gluten Free options easier.
- As always our salads, pizzas, sandwiches, rolls, and baguettes are made fresh each day.
- Healthier, homemade options have been added to the menu including pasta napolitana, pasta and meatballs, tuna mornay, pumpkin soup and sultanas. This will give parents more options and flexibility with food choices.
- There are now more healthier options available over the counter to purchase at recess and lunch time. Including popcorn, Gluten Free chips, sultanas, Homemade Cheesys (melted cheese on a roll) and homemade vegemite or pizza scrolls.



- More options to be added in the future include: Butter chicken, corn on the cob, bliss balls and mini yoghurt.
