Maths

Daily Maths Chats have been incorporated into each Maths lesson. The students have been highly engaged in the interactive activities which allows for consistent review of foundation maths skills including counting, subitising, addition/subtraction and collecting and analysing data.

Literacy

This term the focus is on the literary recount 'Are We There Yet?' by Alison Lester. Students have looked at the structure of the text with a particular focus on the orientation. We used the process I see, I think, I wonder to look deeply at the front cover and the pictures in the text.

Water Safety

This week we have participated in Water Safety lessons at Noarlunga Swimming Centre. Students have learnt skills to stay safe in the water. All children have enjoyed these lessons and there has been amazing progress from everyone.
